The QNAP TL-Rx00PES-RP JBOD enclosures are designed to increase the capacity and utility of your NAS, providing a wide range of storage applications. You can manage installed drives independently or configure them as software RAID groups using the host NAS.

The TL-R1200PES-RP, TL-R1600PES-RP, and TL-R2400PES-RP feature twelve, sixteen, and twenty-four 3.5-inch SATA drive bays, and two SFF-8644 1x2 ports.

3. Hardware Installation

This section provides information on installing drives, connecting and disconnecting the JBOD enclosure from a NAS, hot-swapping redundant power supply units, and rail kits.

Installing drives

The TL-Rx00PES-RP is compatible with 3.5-inch hard drives and 2.5-inch solid-state drives.

Connecting and disconnecting the JBOD enclosure

The TL-Rx00PES-RP supports connecting to a QNAP NAS for storage expansion. Additionally, the JBOD enclosure supports hot-plugging and cascade configuration.

Hot-plugging the JBOD enclosure on a NAS

The TL-Rx00PES-RP supports hot-plugging on a QNAP NAS. You can connect or disconnect the JBOD enclosure from a NAS while the NAS is powered on, with the following restrictions and precautions:

- Hot-plugging is only supported when creating a storage pool on the JBOD enclosure using only disks installed on the JBOD enclosure.
- Hot-plugging is not supported when expanding a storage pool on the NAS with disks on the JBOD enclosure.
- To prevent data loss or other damages, do not hot-disconnect the JBOD enclosure if a storage pool or RAID group has been created on the IBOD enclosure. If you must disconnect the IBOD enclosure under this circumstance, contact an authorized administrator to perform this action.
- When disconnecting the JBOD enclosure from a NAS, always safely detach the JBOD enclosure from the NAS operating system before disconnecting any cables. For details, see Disconnecting the JBOD enclosure from a NAS.

Connecting the JBOD enclosure to a NAS

To connect the JBOD enclosure to a NAS, you must use a compatible NAS model with a recommended QNAP operating system version and the latest BIOS firmware version. Depending on the PCIe slot on the NAS, you must also install a compatible host bus adapter on the NAS and use a compatible connector cable.

• The QXP-3X4PES and QXP-3X8PES host bus adapters each have two ports supporting up to two JBOD connections. You can connect additional JBOD enclosures using a cascade configuration.

- You can purchase QNAP expansion cards and cables from https://shop.gnap.com/ or an authorized reseller.
- **1.** Ensure the NAS is powered off. Skip this step if you are hot-connecting the JBOD enclosure to the NAS. For details, see Hot-plugging the JBOD enclosure on a NAS.
- 2. Install the QXP-3X4PES or QXP-3X8PES host bus adapter on the NAS. Refer to the hardware installation section of the NAS user guide for instructions on installing expansion cards.
- **3.** Prepare SFF-8644 connector cables. Use a compatible cable for the host bus adapter:

Host Bus Adapter	Cable		
QXP-3X4PES		CAB-PCIE10M-8644-4X (32 Gbps connection speed)	
QXP-3X8PES	CAB-PCIE10M-8644-8X (64 Gbps connection speed)		
	Note You can also use the CAB-PCIE10M-8644-4X cable with the QXP-3X8PES. However, the connection speed will be limited to a maximum of 32 Gbps.		

4. Connect the JBOD enclosure to the NAS.



Important

- When connecting the CAB-PCIE10M-8644-8X cable, ensure you insert the cable plug into the port in one quick action. Do not wiggle the plug or insert too slowly, otherwise protection mode will be activated and the connection speed will be reduced.
- When protection mode is activated, the connector link LEDs on both ends of the connection flash orange. To reestablish a normal connection, safely detach the JBOD enclosure from QTS or QuTS hero, disconnect the connector cable, restart the NAS, and then reconnect the IBOD enclosure.
- a. Connect a SFF-8644 connector cable to the SFF-8644 port on the host bus adapter (HBA) installed on the NAS.



Note

To connect a CAB-PCIE10M-8644-4X cable to a QXP-3X8PES host bus adapter, you must insert the cable plug into the A1 port or B1 port of the adapter, and the connection speed will be limited to a maximum of 32 Gbps. Do not insert the cable plug into the A2 port or B2 port of the adapter.

For the location of the adapter ports, check the labels on the adapter.


b. Connect a SFF-8644 connector cable to the upstream SFF-8644 port on the JBOD enclosure.



Note

• When using the CAB-PCIE10M-8644-4X cable, connect to the left side of the port.

• For the location of the upstream ports, see Rear panel.




5. Optional: Connect additional JBOD enclosures to the NAS.



Important

When connecting multiple JBOD enclosures, make sure both the power cable and CAB-PCIE10M-8644-4X cables are properly connected to the first JBOD, and then make your way down the rest of the JBOD enclosures.

Depending on the host bus adapter, use one of the following topologies when connecting multiple JBOD enclosures to the NAS.





Note

- When using the CAB-PCIE10M-8644-4X cable, always connect to the left side of the port for both upstream and downstream ports.
- When both ports of the host bus adapter are connected, the total bandwidth of the PCIe slot on the NAS is shared between the two connections.
- Use the upstream port only when connecting to the NAS or to an upstream JBOD enclosure in a cascade configuration.
- Use the downstream port only when connecting to a downstream JBOD enclosure in a cascade configuration.
- For the location of the upstream and downstream ports, see Rear panel.
- 6. Power on the JBOD enclosures.
- 7. Power on the NAS.

Skip this step if the NAS is already powered on and you are hot-connecting the JBOD enclosure.

- **8.** Verify that the JBOD enclosures are recognized by the NAS.
 - **a.** Log on to QTS or QuTS hero as an administrator.
 - b. Go to Main Menu > Storage & Snapshots > Overview > Storage.
 - **c.** Verify that the JBOD enclosures are listed.



Note

- The NAS may take up to 30 seconds to detect the JBOD enclosures and the installed drives.
- The higher the number of connected enclosures and installed drives, the longer it may take the NAS to detect them.
- Before the NAS detects a JBOD enclosure, the status LED on the JBOD enclosure displays orange, indicating standby mode. When the JBOD enclosure is in standby mode, the fans and drive LEDs on the enclosure remain turned off.

Disconnecting the IBOD enclosure from a NAS

When disconnecting (including hot-disconnecting) the IBOD enclosure from a NAS, always safely detach the JBOD enclosure from the NAS operating system before disconnecting any cables.

Disconnecting the cables without safely detaching the JBOD enclosure can cause data loss or other damages.



Do not hot-disconnect the JBOD enclosure if a storage pool or RAID group has been created on the JBOD enclosure. If you must disconnect the JBOD enclosure under this circumstance, contact an authorized administrator to perform this action.

- **1.** Log in to QTS or QuTS hero on the NAS.
- 2. Go to Storage & Snapshots > Storage > Disks/V|BOD > NAS and Enclosure.
- **3.** Select the IBOD enclosure.
- **4.** Click **Action**, and then select **Safely Detach**. The JBOD enclosure is safely detached.
- **5.** Disconnect the connector cable from the NAS.




When disconnecting multiple JBOD enclosures, make sure to start from the last JBOD and properly disconnect both the power cable and CAB-PCIE10M-8644-4X, and then make your way up the rest of the JBOD enclosures.

Hot-swapping redundant power supply units

- 1. Disconnect the power cord from the electrical outlet and the power supply unit (PSU) that you are replacing.
- 2. Firmly press the latch toward the handle and then pull the PSU out.



3. Insert the new PSU.



4. Connect the power cord to the PSU and the electrical outlet.

4. Basic Operations

This chapter describes basic operations of the JBOD enclosure.

Power button

Operation	User Action	Result
Power on	Press the button once.	The device powers on or wakes up from standby mode.
Standby mode	Press and hold the button for 1.5 seconds.	The drives and fans turn off and the device goes into standby mode.
Force power off	Press and hold the button for 5 seconds.	The device powers off. Note Use this method only when the device is unresponsive. When the device is powered off, the host NAS cannot control the power status of the device.

LEDs

System Status LED

Status	Description
Red	A system fan is not functioning.
	The system temperature is over 65°C.
	One or more power supply units are abnormal.
Green	The device is ready.
Orange	The device is in standby mode.
Off	All drives are in standby mode.
	The device is powered off.

Drive LED

Status	Description
Green	The device is powered on.
	The drive can be accessed.
Flashes green	Data is being accessed.
Red	A drive read/write error occurred.
Flashes amber at 4 Hz	The drive is being located in the operating system.
All drive LEDs flash green and red at 1 Hz	The device is being located in the operating system.
Off	No drive was detected.

5. Troubleshooting

This chapter describes basic troubleshooting information.

Forcing Storage & Snapshots to recognize the JBOD enclosure

If Storage & Snapshots is unable to locate the JBOD enclosure during operation, the drives or data on the JBOD enclosure may be faulty.

- 1. Power off the JBOD enclosure.
- 2. Disconnect the JBOD enclosure from the NAS.
- **3.** Remove all drives from the JBOD enclosure.
- **4.** Reconnect the JBOD enclosure to the NAS.
- **5.** Power on the JBOD enclosure.
- **6.** Locate the JBOD enclosure using Storage & Snapshots.
- 7. Reinsert the drives.
- **8.** Continue with operation.

- **5.** Remove the failed drive from the JBOD enclosure.
- **6.** Wait for 30 seconds or until the JBOD enclosure beeps twice.
- **7.** Remove the failed drive from the drive tray.
- **8.** Insert the new drive into the drive tray.
- **9.** Install the new drive. The JBOD enclosure beeps twice.
- **10.** Wait for 30 seconds or until the JBOD enclosure beeps twice.
- 11. Go to Main Menu > Storage & Snapshots > Storage > Storage/Snapshots .
- **12.** Locate the storage pool that contains the new drive and then verify that the status is Rebuilding.
